The program is designed to support the psychological well-being, peer support capacity, and overall resilience of Rhode Island’s law enforcement community through coordinated clinical services, training, and crisis response.

We are seeking a Clinical Coordinator to lead the behavioral health and clinical oversight of this program. This is a part-time (10–20 hours per week) position offering flexible scheduling—ideal for a licensed behavioral health professional with a strong background in trauma, first responder wellness, and critical incident response.

Responsibilities

- Provide clinical leadership and oversight for the Law Enforcement Wellness and Resilience Program.
- Serve as the primary clinical advisor on law enforcement mental health, wellness, and crisis intervention initiatives.
- Collaborate with law enforcement agencies and peer support teams statewide to develop, deliver, and oversee training and clinical support programs.
- Respond on-scene to critical incidents as needed to provide clinical support, consultation, and stabilization for first responders.
- Act as a triage mechanism for departments or partner agencies requesting behavioral health support, connecting them to appropriate clinical, peer, or community resources.
- Maintain and update a comprehensive list of referral and treatment resources for law enforcement personnel and their families.
- Work closely with the Program Director to:
 - Recruit and mentor volunteer clinicians and peer support personnel.
 - Develop and implement policies, procedures, and deployment protocols for the program.
 - Design and coordinate training opportunities for peer support members and clinical volunteers.
- Support data collection and reporting related to program participation, outcomes, and resource utilization.
- Participate in outreach, education, and community engagement activities to strengthen interagency collaboration.
